FILE: Quick Reaction Force training

NARRATOR

The Quick reaction Force provides a rapid emergency force in response to hostile threats.

FILE: Demining Team with SFOR supervisors

NARRATOR

10th Mountain Division Engineers and supporting Explosive Ordnance Disposal teams work with, and monitor, international and Entity Armed Forces demining teams throughout Multinational Division North.

In addition, to the traditional probing method, where one man can clear up to four meters of land per day,

FILE: Route Kansas coordination meeting

NARRATOR

Civil leaders in the towns along the route donated fuel, oil, construction supplies and money to support the emergency repair project.

NARRATOR

Critical emergency repairs were completed on the road surfaces and numerous bridges by EAF and SFOR engineer soldiers, sustaining the route through winter.

NARRATOR

The 10th mountain Division supervised relocation or deactivation of Bosnian military in the Brcko District. This coordination was tense, but professionally managed.

The Joint Military Commission provides leadership and guidance to the Entity Armed Forces for the furthering of armed forces professionalism. Ultimately, the plan is for the two armed forces to become one army.

The Joint Military Commission works very closely with the EAF's to underscore standards, facilitate confidence and promote transparency and confidence among them.

NARRATOR

SFOR, in cooperation with the Entity Armed Forces, administered and monitored Operation Fall Harvest '99, a program to get Bosnians to turn in guns, ammunition, mines and other weapons left over from the Bosnian civil war.

FILE: Engineering shots surveying roads

NARRATOR

One of the first tasks of the 10th Mountain Division Engineers was to assess bridges and the road system throughout the area of operations.

FILE: Route Kansas coordination meeting in Lopare

NARRATOR

The MND(N) JMC and Division Engineers began working with the Entity Armed Forces, Local communities and the International Community to rebuild the weakened infrastructure. Because of washouts, mud slides, flooding, avalanches, years of war and neglect, Division engineers are constantly on the road

FILE: Engineers survey Route Kansas

NARRATOR

U.S. and Russian army engineers cooperated with and facilitated the Entity Armed Forces, local Mayor's and municipalities planning and repair of Route Kansas.

NARRATOR

Stabilization forces followed the initial implementation force.

FILE: Graphic - Map of Bosnia. The map clearly shows the Federation and the Republika of Sprska

NARRATOR

The country of Bosnia and Herzegovina is made up of two entities. Muslims and Croats united as the Federation, and Serbs form the Republika of Sprska. Muslims and Croats are not really united although they are supposed to be to form the Federation.

FILE: Government meeting in Bosnia.

NARRATOR

The country has three co-presidents,

FILE: VF and VRS Soldiers.

NARRATOR

two armed forces, (supposed to have only two but in reality have three)

FILE: City street scenes (Federation) showing the

City Street scenes (Republika of Sprska)

NARRATOR

three ethnic groups, three languages -- Croatian, Serbian, and Bosnian -- and both Cyrillic and Latin alphabets.

FILE: Graphic Map of Bosnia clearly showing the Zone of separation.

(Put "ZOS" in the graphic)

NARRATOR

The Zone of Separation, a two-kilometer wide demilitarization zone, was established to keep both sides safe from heavy weapons. In most areas, the ZOS was the final front line of the war, (Actually the ZOS is 4 Kms wide, two either side of the IEBL. The IEBL represents the rough front line of the war.)

FILE: Aerial shots of BiH. Shots of mountains, valleys, and farmland.

NARRATOR

Bosnia and Herzegovina's terrain ranges from rolling hills to steep mountains, and the country's people are basically agrarian.

FILE: Aerial shots Camp McGovern

NARRATOR

Camp McGovern, the original camp after IFOR bridged the Sava River in 1995 is home to Task Force 2-87 Catamounts.

FILE: Aerial shots Camp Dobil

NARRATOR

Camp Dobil is home to Task Force 1-16 Iron Rangers.

FILE: Soldiers on patrol with Bosnians in the shot

NARRATOR

These patrols encompass the essence of what SFOR is doing in Bosnia and Herzegovina, by providing a safe and secure environment. Approximately 100 presence patrols are conducted day and night. (Check numbers don't think it is that high more around 80-90)

FILE: Presence patrol

NARRATOR

SFOR presence patrols were needed on a daily basis to thwart possible violence. 10th Mountain Division's mission is to assure the populace that it is safe to return to their pre-war home and allow freedom of movement. This is a daunting task. (Really local police job. We support local police who provide security)

FILE: JMC conference

NARRATOR

The 10th mountain Division supervised relocation or deactivation (disbandment instead of deactivation) of Bosnian military in the Brcko District. This coordination was tense, but professionally managed.

FILE: Individual, Crew-served and Heavy Weapons

NARRATOR

The Dayton Peace Accords requires the Bosnian Entity Armed forces to store all their weapons in SFOR designated weapons storage sites (WSS).

FILE: WSS inspection team working

NARRATOR

10th mountain division monitors compliance with the Dayton Peace Accords through announced and unannounced WSS inspections.

FILE: Modern storage site

NARRATOR

to highly sophisticated inventoried weapons caches (don't use caches use storage areas or something else.)

FILE: Inspection team

NARRATOR

Compliance is mandatory or items of like kind are removed from the site as a penalty. (Say when they are over or under, a like amount of weapons are confiscated)

FILE: Map

NARRATOR

The road, which runs from Tuzla through Lopare and Celic, to Brcko, is and important commerce route that connects portions of Serb and Bosniac territories. (Would recommend we say the Federation and RS)

FILE: Helos in flight

The 10th Aviation brigade, with it's AH-64 Apaches, UH-60 Blackhawks and OH-58 Kiowa Warrior helicopters, flew countless mission hours in support of the Division.
